#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**SemBioSys:** The lease has been assigned to a new receivership company. They have indicated plans to keep the lease until June/July 2013, possibly longer.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**LPCA:** LPCA President submitted the attached counter proposal to the OPDA board's initial motion of "Kim Ramm moved, Mike Edens 2<sup>nd</sup>, a motion to approve Garco Construction contract with stipulation of Irrevocable Letter of Credit in the amount of \$78,000 from the LPCA to secure design phase and cost overruns that may be incurred during construction. Mark DeWulf is to create Irrevocable Letter of Credit and review documents to meet acceptable terms. Motion Passed 6-0." Discussion was held regarding the counterproposal between the OPDA board and LPCA representative Wade King.

**Action:** Kim Ramm moved, Mike Eden 2<sup>nd</sup> to resend the motion "Kim Ramm moved, Mike Edens 2<sup>nd</sup>, a motion to approve Garco Construction contract with stipulation of Irrevocable Letter of Credit in the amount of \$78,000 from the LPCA to secure design phase and cost overruns that may be incurred during construction. Mark DeWulf is to create Irrevocable Letter of Credit and review documents to meet acceptable terms." Motion carried. 6-0

**Action:** Kim Ramm moved, George Rodeck 2<sup>nd</sup> to accept the offer contained in the attached letter from LPCA Board President Willard Wolf. Motion carried. 6-0

**Action:** Clark Kagele moved, Kim Ramm 2<sup>nd</sup> to approve and sign the Garco Construction contract. Motion carried. 6-0

**Action:** Clark Kagele moved, Todd King 2<sup>nd</sup> to authorize Jim Walter to sign the Garco Construction contract in place of the Board President. Motion carried. 6-0.

Additionally, the LPCA will be kept informed of all notices regarding invoices/changes as well as any overall project updates.

**IEO:** Joel Edmonds reported IEO is still waiting to hear from the Department of Commerce regarding their loan position. Joel will be meeting with the minority owners to discuss other financing options. Discussion was held regarding how to proceed with OPDA's loan payment to WSDA.

**Action:** Jim Walter moved, Todd King 2<sup>nd</sup> to pay WSDA loan payment, if IEO makes their lease payment to OPDA prior to December 5, 2012. Motion carried. 6-0.

**Budget:** The 2013 OPDA Budget was presented and discussed.

**Staff Position:** Stacey Rasmussen will continue to be the OPDA Administrative Assistant under her current contract, but is allowed to increase her hours up to an average of 30 hours per week, as necessary.

RE: Garco contract signing

Dear Mr. Kagele,

We understand that the OPDA made a final motion at your meeting this past week to sign the Garco contract that included one condition to make sure the project has enough contingency to get the plant construction completed.

Kim Ramm moved, Mike Eden 2<sup>nd</sup>, a motion to approve Garco Construction contract with stipulation of Irrevocable Letter of Credit in the amount of \$78,000 from the LPCA to secure design phase and cost overruns that may be incurred during construction. Mark DeWulf is to create Irrevocable Letter of Credit and review documents to meet acceptable terms.

The LPCA is proposing to pay the first design invoices up to \$57,000 that are included in the OPDA and Garco construction contract, in exchange for the OPDA withdrawing the above motion to require the LPCA to sign an Irrevocable Letter of Credit. Therefore, the LPCA is pledging \$57,000 to be paid directly to Garco when invoiced.

The LPCA trusts this proposal will satisfactorily address the OPDA's concerns.

The LPCA believes it is in the best interest of everyone involved to get the Gareo construction contract signed, move forward and keep the momentum.
